### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2015, John Allwood & myself attended the 100<sup>th</sup> Annual State Conference of the Victorian RSL at the Caulfield Racecourse.

The Premier of Victoria Daniel Andrews MP spoke & advised 1 million was set aside to: recognise Vietnam Veterans during 2016, to improve on the State wide veterans service, introduce travel concessions for veterans & strengthen ties with schools, communities etc.

RSL State President Major General David McLachlan AO reflected on the RSL's achievements last year: paid pension officers in delegated areas, providing homeless veterans with assistance, introduced volunteer protection, the success of RSL appeals, RSL membership was 150,000 members, gaming machine licences were due for renewal in 2022, RSL of the year was Keilor, \$250,000 was provided to the Shrine, and 2016 was the Centenary of the RSL.

The State President then presented Professor Jeffrey Rosenfeld, who launched our 'Stretcher Bearer's Book' with an award in recognition of his military involvement and his 620 publications.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Senator Ronaldson, stated that with the new technologies available, today's focus is the early intervention of mental health issues. Indexation on service &disability payments have been retained in the budget. \$12.1 million has been allocated to the Dept with 1% set aside for commemorations & for new generations to understand the service and sacrifice. \$10 million is available for complex claims & rehabilitation funding ie: 20 hours weekly work arrangements in preference to disability payments. He said he was passionate about rehabilitating returning veterans but was not to be seen as replacing disability payments. Teleport services have been provided & there will be no reductions in TPI disabilities. The centenary of ANZAC travelling display will commence in Wodonga and the planning of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the battle of Long Tan in 2016 has begun. The return & recognition of deceased veterans from Malaya will be undertaken. The Minister spoke of the imminent release of the Vietnam Veterans study & the future challenges for the today's veterans.

The outcome of the ballot was status quo for the executive with all positions returned. The discussion on remits tendered saw all rule modifications adopted with a Bronze Medallion member of a Surf Life Saving Club becoming eligible as an affiliate member. Fees for "Life and 50" year membership certificates be amended so that these awards be made free of charge to the Sub-Branch.

Researchers for the WA Transport Authority found over 200 dead crows near Geraldton recently, and there was concern that they may have died from Avian Flu.

### **GALLIPOLI 2015**



Just as a bit of background information, ANZAC day has always been an important day for me. From a child my parents, especially my father, Nev, instilled a great need to remember who had fallen, who were injured and to all that serve in our military services.

Dad had a successful military career, but in the last 15 years ago, I heard about his grandfather, George McKillop, who I think Dad mirrored his military career on, whether intentionally or not.

Just a little information on George McKillop- George left Australia on 11th February 1915 with the 13th Battalion. On the 12th of April, he was promoted to a Company Sergeant Major.

On 25th April, he was in the 3rd wave of troops that landed on what was to become known as ANZAC Cove, around 6am.

The 13th Battalion were involved in heavy fighting. George was evacuated on 22nd August to a hospital ship and eventually arrived in Perham Downs in England. There he became part of the 68th Battalion.

He didn't arrive home in Australia until late 1917 and was eventually medically discharged in early 1918. His 2nd daughter, Florence McKillop my grand mother and her family must have gone through some horrible times during this 3 year period, as many did. At least they got to see their father and had him for about another 10 years. He died in Sydney in 1926.

I proudly wear my father's medals today, and am so thankful what he has taught me, and to also share my life with Glenn, who also understands and is as respectful to remember who came before us, who laid down their lives to allow us to have the life we have today.

The following is a brief explanation on how the day panned out on 24th/25th April 2015......

Arrived at Hagia Sofia at 8.30am. Bus 8 we were told!! Our bus has a mixture of Australians and New Zealanders. Was made up of husbands & wives, brothers, fathers and sons & daughters.

A good friend of the Mt Evelyn RSL, Leisa Logan, has just returned from attending the Centenary of Anzac services at Gallipoli.

She has kindly allowed us to publish her diary from her trip (see below).

A great report of an historic occasion – thanks for sharing Leisa.

Some were no longer living in Australia or New Zealand but met here to be part of this ceremony.

Many, many security checkpoints.

BBQ! for 700 people around 2 hours south of Istanbul. Just 3 BBQs. Gave us a chance to meet up and talk to some people. Met many people - in particular Bruce Graham and his daughter Nicole.

Arrived at ANZAC Cove and grand stands at approximately 8.30pm.

Watching many documentaries, which ranged from Australia, New Zealand and Turkish. Really enjoyed watching the old "Australians at War" shows and the stories about the AE2.

2am - the Master of Ceremonies advised that the final ballot recipients had arrived and we were in lockdown! Big yay went through the crowd.

At around 3.30am we had 3 choirs from Australia, New Zealand and Turkish - absolutely beautiful.

I need to explain at this point, it is pitch black, 10,000 people, the most beautiful sounding choirs - a bit surreal.

Military band was made up on Australian and New Zealand military bands.

Master of Ceremonies brought on an historian from the Australian War Memorial. They went through the battles that happened at Gallipoli, as he was explaining these, they had spotlights highlighting the hills behind us showing us the height they were trying get to. This was a mad man's battle especially when you see how high the hills are behind us - The Neck and the Sphinx.

At 4am the "Reflection Piece" started.

It started with a didgeridoo then there was a Maori tradition of "calling of the dead" called Karanga. It needs to be completed by the oldest female member of the tribe. It is a call to the ancestors to protect the living. WOW is all I can say - it put an eeriness feeling around the place, but a peaceful one.

They then put on the screen some of the names and photos of the ANZACs that died on this day 100 years ago.

#### **DAWN SERVICE**

It started really slowly. All the lights slowly dimmed. The spotlights were then turned towards the water and all you could hear was the lapping of the waves.

As dawn started all you could here was this, with the birds chirping.

Amazing sight and feeling.

Then there was the Last Post - minute silence and Reveille.

Speeches were wonderful. No cringe moments. All lovely. Especially loved the speech from Prince Charles - a letter from a soldier to his wife - unfortunately he never came home.

The 3 national anthems were sung. Love the Turkish one -very powerful - along with their marching! A lot of effort required for both.....

#### **LONE PINE**

About 7.30pm started to head towards Lone Pine.

Quite a long steep walk. A bit of grumbling in the crowd with security checks - but it eased up.

We walked along the 2nd Ridge - Artillery Road. Really high up - amazing views.

At this point the Kiwi's turn off to Chanuk Bair. This is another ridge higher - Far Out! so high.... From what we found out their battle was pretty fierce. Body on Body.

Loved the rivalry between the Aussies and Kiwi's - still strong - but believe an amazing link - which I believe will be even stronger

Arrived at Lone Pine at 11am. Massive security build up. Soldiers everywhere. Weapons range is exhaustive.

Weather has now started to close in. Starting to get cold now. Wind up at Lone Pine is freezing - no protection. It must have been horrific for the soldiers in 1915. The mud, the bodies, the rain - cannot imagine

The service begins.... so proud. The Masters of Ceremonies asks for all current and previous serving military to stand. Glenn stands and they all receive a standing ovation. So nicely done. Will never forget this day.

Wonderful ceremony. Prince Harry's speech is lovely - I know why they love him - he is very endearing - even from a distance. Prince Charles and Harry, after the service take the time to talk to many veterans. I know it is their job, but to see the eyes of the old veterans, it is beautiful.

Still cannot believe that I have been a part of this amazing event. I am sure that Dad and George McKillop are watching over me. I hope if they are, they see me leave George's photo at the 13th Battalion memorial, my best friend's (Ann) grandfather's photo alongside him. They may not have met in life, (you never know though??) but they are linked now at Gallipoli.

I also leave at ANZAC Cove a small pebble, from my cousin, Kris. This pebble is from Concord Repatriation hospital - this hospital was a veterans hospital.

We finally get on our bus at 4.30pm to go back to Istanbul. We are one of the lucky ones - probably there is another 380 buses to go. I hope they got the veterans off first, as it was freezing!

We arrive back in Istanbul at 11.30pm, so have been awake for at least 38 hours. Mind you I think we slept an hour or two on the bus home.

Looking back now - I have to single out the Turkish people. They are so welcoming - they also suffered horrific losses. 70000 brothers/sons.

So to all the Australian, New Zealanders and Turkish men that fought and died 100 years ago

"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old;
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning

We will remember them."

Dr Bart Ziino, World War One historian who grew up in Mt Evelyn, will unveil the main plaque and special guests will unveil the 18 individual plaques.



The Heroic Life of George Ingram VC, MM



This is the biography of Captain George Ingram VC, MM, the Yarra Valley's only recipient of the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest award for valor on the battlefield.

From a country boyhood growing up in Seville, to serving with the artillery in Victoria and Rabaul and on to the horror and heroism of the Western Front with the 24<sup>th</sup> Battalion AIF where he was awarded both the Military Medal and the Victoria Cross.

After the war he spent time as a soldier settler before serving with the Shrine Guard and the Royal Australian Engineers in WW2.



# A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.


## MILITIA CAMP





### BILL HARRISON'S STORY-pt 11

This is the story of one of our past members, Bill Harrison. Bill served with the 1<sup>st</sup> Independent Company during World War Two and was a member of the Mt Evelyn RSL for a short time in the 1990's. In 1999 Anthony McAleer sat down with him and interviewed him about his memories of the war. What follows is Bill's story.....

Last issue: The war ended

### Even though the war had ended was it still dangerous on Borneo?

We were in a forward position and the Nips were only fifty yards in front of us, so we still had to be very, very careful. We had a few blokes wounded a few days after the armistice, because the Nips hadn't been told. They were away from their parent body and temporarily out of contact with their headquarters and didn't know about it. Three of our guys came across one of these, they were reluctant to shoot but the Nips weren't and shot them. Eventually planes went and dropped leaflets over them.

### How long were you on Borneo for?

All up we were on Borneo for about three months or so. About Christmas time we went to a surrender ceremony where the Japanese handed over their weapons. We marvelled when we saw these Nips, how something so insignificant could cause so much trouble. Many people would say after the war how close it came to the Nips winning the war but none of us even remotely considered the possibility of them winning the war, you really couldn't take the Nips seriously.

### After the war did you have any effects from your service?

Malaria, low fever, continued for about another six or seven years for me. It killed my brother Norman who served in the tropics as well. He had low fever and when you get malaria your spleen becomes very much enlarged. His spleen ruptured and had to be removed and he died about three years later in 1957.

### What are your feelings about the Japanese today?

I still feel the same about the Japanese, they're just animals, I can't regard them as being humans. I've got nothing but contempt for them. Their treachery and the claims they make to being civilised are quite laughable.

Bill Harrison passed away in December 2012.
