




CHAMBER AWARDS

The Mt Evelyn RSL has had some new stubby holders made promoting the club.


Above: Is a brand new one commemorating the 50th anniversary of the foundation meeting in 1968 that created the club.





A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2nd Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come



THE MAN WHO GOT THEM SAFELY OFF GALLIPOLI



On December 8th, 1915 there were 38,500 Australian troops occupying trenches on Gallipoli, facing a larger Turkish force of some 80,000. Twelve days later they had all been evacuated from the Peninsula without the loss of a man and without the enemy



them when in fact they had long gone. It would earn for him the Distinguished Conduct Medal and the gratitude of those who had got off Gallipoli safely.

But this was only a small part of the Bill Scurry story. From Egypt to Gallipoli and on to the Western Front, where he lost an eye and gained the Military Cross. Then to his post-war days as a soldier settler in Silvan Second World War.



CLAUDE ALBERT ATKINSON

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

Claude Albert Atkinson was born in 1897 at Coburg, Victoria, the son of Albert Robert Atkinson and Amy Eva Atkinson. When he was young his family moved to Picnic Hill on the Warburton Hwy at Wandin North and Claude grew up here, attending the Lilydale State School.

After he finished his schooling he went to work for the Victorian Railways and was working here when, on March 6th, 1916, he decided to walk into the recruiting centre at the Melbourne Town Hall and enlist in the AIF. He was 18 years old at the time and as a result he had to have a letter with his parent's permission before he could be accepted. His medical records show that he was five feet, five inches tall, had brown hair and blue eyes.

He undertook his initial training at the AIF training camp at Broadmeadows where his was allotted to 'C' Company of the original 24th Battalion and he was given the regimental number 591. He embarked with his unit from Port Melbourne on the HMAT Euripides on May 8th, 1915.

The following month he was in camp at Egypt and then in August was sent with the 24th Battalion to Gallipoli, arriving at Anzac Cove in September. For the next sixteen weeks he served in the front lines at Lone Pine before being evacuated with the rest of the Anzac force off the Peninsula in December 1915.

He was eventually sent back to Egypt where a few months later the AIF were reorganised in preparation for being sent to the Western Front. In March 1916 the 24th Battalion was sent to France arriving in the Somme Valley area in May.

On July 23rd, 1916 the Battle of Pozieres began and a few days later the 24th Battalion took part in its first offensive operations in this campaign. On August 5th Claude was in the front line when he was wounded severely in the left thigh. Stretcher bearers carried him to the nearest casualty clearing station and from here he was admitted to the base hospital at Camiers. He died of his wounds here the next day, he was nineteen years old.

He was buried at the Etaples Military Cemetery in France.

However the Atkinson family's tragedy wouldn't end there. When the telegram announcing that Claude had died of wounds arrived at their home, the shock and grief of the news was too much for his grandfather who had a heart attack and died just after receiving the notification.

A special service was later held in Claude's memory by the community at the Picnic Hill Church at Wandin North.

His father, Albert Robert Atkinson, enlisted soon after Claude's death and served with the Australian Army Medical Corps, returning to Australia in 1919

His younger brother, William Reginald Atkinson, also enlisted and served on the Western Front during 1917 as a gunner with the 120 Howitzer Brigade.

In a letter to his mother in April 1917 he wrote the following: "On my way up here I passed through, and one night camped on, the famous battlefield of last year, the one where ten thousand of our best lads laid down their lives in the defence of right (Claude amongst them), namely Pozieres, where Claude was killed. The awful sight is indescribable.

All that remained of trenches was a gutter, and there wasn't a square yard that hadn't been shell torn, and I gazed on the steep heights, and thought of the price it cost to take it. But it doesn't do to brood too much on this sort of thing. Here and there I could see a little cross in the paddocks that

indicated the last resting place of some mother's boy. All that remained of the village itself was a sign board with thePozieres on it. And then I thought, here, nine months ago, Claude passed through a veritable hell, for that's what it was, and on the dawn of victory, passed away. Truly he played the game, gave his best, and I firmly believe now has his reward. That to me is a very comforting thought".
