The bartender says, 'Oh, they're all grey nomads from the caravan park, waiting for happy hour when drinks are half price'.



Cecil Benjamin Farr

On Thursday July 28th, 2016 the Lilydale RSL held a special service at the Mooroolbark War Memorial to honour Cecil Farr, a local soldier who was killed in action during the Battle of Pozieres

Cecil Farr was born at Mooroolbark and grew up at Ferntree Gully. He served with the 8th Battalion along with his brother William. He was killed in action along the Bapuame Road by shell fire, he was 23.

Students from Bimbadeen Primary School & Tony Smith MP were in attendance.

Edwin Poyner

On Tuesday August 16th, 2016 the Lilydale RSL held another special service at the Lilydale War Memorial to honour Edwin Poyner, a local soldier who was killed in action during the Battle of Mouquet Farm.

Edwin Poyner was born at Lilydale and enlisted with his brother Frank in the 6th Battalion. On this day they were sheltering in a shell hole when an artillery bomb landed near them – burying and killing Edwin and another soldier. Frank survived but ended up with shell shock.

Students from Lilydale Primary School and Edwin's niece, Jan Poyner, were in attendance.

Arthur Anderson, Thomas Morton and Andrew Holland

On Monday July 25th, 2016 the Lilydale RSL held another special service to honour three Lilydale soldiers – all who were killed in action on the same day in the fighting around Pozieres and Mouquet Farm.

Thomas Morton was born at Lilydale and served with the 8th Battalion. He was 33. Arthur Anderson worked for the railways and lived in Lilydale, he served with the 8th Battalion and was just 19. Andrew Holland lived at Yering and served with the 8th Battalion, he was 23. The President of the Lilydale Football Club & RSL members were in attendance.

KIM FAWKES NOTES

In this edition we start up a new column by military historian Kim Fawkes where he will regularly share with us some interesting items of military history.

LITTLE OLD LADY TO SOLDIER: "And how often do you get leave to go home to Australia?"

SOLDIER "Once every war."

~ The "Tin Hat" ~

The French were first issued with steel helmets in the Spring of 1915. Samples were sent to Britain and by the end of October 1915 a total of 2500 helmets of an improved pattern had been supplied on the scale of 50 to 1 battalion. Refinements on the original design resulted in the Brodie helmet, manufactured from hardened manganese steel capable of resisting shrapnel at 750 feet per second. Manufacture began in November 1915 (dispelling the belief our diggers at Gallipoli had them) and by March 1916 a total of 140,000 had been issued in France. Delivery of the first million was achieved by July 1916. One and a half million were supplied to American troops. By the end of the war 7,250,000 helmets had been issued.

"There is much good in the worst of us. And so much bad in the best of us. That it behoves any of us. To find fault with the rest of us".

THINGS WE NEVER HEARD IN THE ARMY -

Officer to soldier: 'Now tell me your idea of strategy". Soldier to officer: "It's when you don't let the enemy know you're out of ammunition and you say BANG! BANG!". 'Did they get the Spirit of ANZAC out of the SRD (Service Rum Distillate or Seldom Reaches Destination) jar?"

Did you know the 1st AIF officially went out of existence on 1 April 1921? The Great War began officially on 4 August 1914 and ended officially on 31 August 1921. It had a duration of 7 years and 21 days. In May 1918 the Germans stated in their reports that the soldiers most feared and who were the most courageous were Australians, Guards, 51st Highland Division.

Norman Hooke

On Thursday September 2016 the Mt Evelyn RSL held the first special service at the Montrose War Memorial to honour local soldier Norman Hooke.

Norman's family had an orchard at Kilsyth although they were very involved with the Montrose community. Norman enlisted in 1915 and served on the Western Front with the 46th Battalion.

He was killed in action during the last days of the battle for Pozieres, he was twenty years old. He has no known grave and is remembered at the Villers Bretonneaux Memorial in France.


MON&SH'S MILITIA CAMP



A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilvdale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2nd Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come



The Heroic Life of George Ingram VC, MM





FRANK ALLEN DIXON

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

Frank Allen Dixon was born in March 1894 at Castlemaine, Victoria, the son of Henry and Kate Dixon. Frank grew up at 18 Aberdeen St, Auburn although he spent much time in Wandin where his uncle and aunty, James and Edith Wilkin, owned an orchard and he often went to stay with them there and helped out.

After finishing school he went to work as a clerk in a government office and before joining the AIF he served for two years in the militia with the 48th (Kooyong) Battalion. On May 1st, 1915 he walked into the recruiting office at the Melbourne Town Hall and enlisted in the AIF. His medical records show he was 5 feet, 9 inches tall, had light brown hair and brown eyes. He was engaged at the time of enlisting.

In June he was in camp at Seymour where he was allotted to the 8th reinforcements of the 7th Battalion, his regimental number was 2575. His experience in the militia must have helped him because soon after he was promoted to Lance Corporal. On August 26th, 1915 he left with his unit aboard the HMAT Anchises and a month later they landed in Egypt.

In November 1915 he went with his unit from Alexandria in Egypt to Mudros Island in preparation for being landed at Gallipoli. However when he arrived at Mudros he contracted mumps and was sent to hospital and by the time he'd recovered from this a month later the military authorities had decided to evacuate the troops from the Gallipoli Peninsula.

In January 1916 he was in camp at Egypt. During this time the AIF was reorganised and Frank was transferred to the 59th Battalion and promoted to the rank of Corporal. In June 1916 the 59th Battalion was sent to France arriving in the Fleurbaix area and in early July he was promoted again to Lance Sergeant.

One soldier who served with him, Private A E Crockett, later wrote of Frank: 'He was the Corporal of the section I was in and we were good pals, he was a fine fellow and was just made Sergeant about a week before he was killed'. The 59th Battalion weren't in France very long when they were sent to Fromelles. On July 19th, 1916 they were ordered to attack. A Lieutenant Hackworthy later recalled that he said goodbye to Frank just before he went over the top and that was the last that was ever seen of him. He was listed as missing soon after; he was aged just 22 years old. Sadly on the same day his cousin, Private E F Wilkin of the 29th Battalion, was also killed in action.

Not long after his parents received a telegram saying he had been reported missing. This was the first of many frustrations for his family. In the coming months none of Frank's items were returned to the family, even after numerous enquiries to the authorities. Secondly a court of enquiry was held into his death and the court ruled he had been 'killed in action'.

However the authorities failed to inform the family of this and the first they heard about it was when it was published in the Argus newspaper that Frank was now 'killed in action'.

Then the worst of all. In February 1917 the family were informed by the YMCA that Frank was being held as a prisoner of war in the Hotel de La Paix in Leysin, Switzerland. The family and his fiancée all wrote letters to him however three months later the military authorities confirmed that this report was false and that he had in fact been killed in action at Fromelles the year before. He is listed on the memorial at VC Corner in Fromelles. France.
