

LAUNCH OF YARRA VALLEY VIETNAM VETERANS BOOK

A good crowd braved bad weather and a terrible car accident in Birmingham Rd to attend the launch of the Mt Evelyn RSL's latest publication – 'Yarra Valley Vietnam Veterans'. The book was launched by Hugh Roberton, president of Melbourne Legacy, and the Hon Tony Smith MP, federal member for Casey and Speaker of the House. The event also included some wonderful musical performances by Alex Borg and Georgia McAleer.

This book consists of interviews with sixteen Vietnam veterans who live in the Yarra Valley, two from the Navy and fourteen from the army. They represent various Corps and ships as well as different periods during the war. They all tell of their experiences during that decade long conflict, before, during and after, and some are telling their stories for the first time.

The book is actually an attempt to give people a better understanding of what Australian servicemen experienced during their time in Vietnam. In some ways their experiences were similar, in many ways they were unique.

The day finished with the interviewees working hard signing copies of the book for those present and everyone enjoying a wonderful afternoon tea put on by the hard working ladies of the club. I commend this publication to you and thank Anthony for his hindsight.

2018 marks the centenary anniversary of the armistice (cessation from hostilities) on the 11th November 1918.

The Mount Evelyn RSL Sub-Branch are considering how we may assist the local schools and community to remember this significant military world historical event can respectively be remembered. We have some plans and are currently waiting to hear whether grant funding will be approved for us to achieve this. 50th ANNIVERSARY OF OUR FOUNDATION MEETING 1968 - 2018









VALE KATHIE FREEMAN




The membership were also very sad to hear of the passing of another wellliked affiliate member, Kathie Freeman.

YARRA VALLEY VIETNAM VETERANS



Fifty years after they served Australia in the Vietnam War, sixteen veterans of that conflict from the Yarra Valley sat down with the Mt Evelyn RSL's historian and revealed, some for the first time, their wartime experiences.

Their stories tell of our nation's involvement in Vietnam and spans the period 1964 to 1972. They served with the Navy, with the Regular Army, with the CMF and as National Servicemen. Their backgrounds varied as much as their experiences 'in country' during that time.

It is a story of sacrifice and endurance, bravery and loss, good times and bad times. It reveals the environment they were forced to exist in and the role they played, from the mundane to the terrifying.


Surviving all of this they then returned home to a nation where many people ignored or even condemned them. For most, those decades after the war were an ongoing battle to deal with the physical and mental scars.

ALFRED HENRY NIBLETT

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

Alfred Niblett was born in England in 1880 and grew up in Leicester. In 1912, at the age of thirty-two, he came out to Victoria on the ship the 'Ballarat'. By 1914 he was living and working in Lilydale and was there when war was declared. Soon after the war started, he decided to join up but not with the AIF. He made arrangements to travel to England to enlist there with the hope of getting into quicker with the British military forces.

Strangely enough he went into camp with the AIF in Broadmeadows and began his military training with them, even though he wasn't a member of the AIF. He was there when the president of the Shire of Lillydale visited the camp and presented all of the local soldiers including Alfred with a certificate of appreciation for enlisting.

In October 1914 he left Melbourne with the first convoy of Australian troops bound for the war. On the way over he witnessed the HMAS Sydney and it's attack on the German ship 'Emden' and remained on board after the Australian troops disembarked in Egypt and travelled on to England.

Arriving in England he wasted no time enlisting in the 19th Battery of the Royal Field Artillery that was attached to the Indian Contingent. He was given leave to have Christmas at home and then went into camp. By February 1915 he was in action in France.

In June, after five months in the frontline, he wrote the following to a friend in Lilydale:

'This is a war, and no mistake the Huns are a dirty lot of fighters. No doubt you have read about their inhuman methods of trying to beat us. They even set fire to our wounded men if they see them move between the trenches. There are plenty of horrible things they do, but we will pay them back at their own game yet. What you see in the papers about them and their tricks is quite true, because I have seen them with my own eyes, and I have had some narrow squeaks myself, but am still smiling, and hope to continue so'.

In March he was involved in the Battle of Neuve Chappelle, an attempt by the British forces to break through the German lines. After much fierce fighting they failed make much headway and only really consoldated the British lines along that sector. In a letter to Lilydale friends Alfred wrote:

'The bombardment of Neuve Chappelle was a hell of its own. We have had several similar ones since. We gave them a proper shaking up too. We will give them "baby killers' before we have done with them. One thing, you are fairly safe from air raids out here. I see by the papers that the Australians and New Zealanders are doing fine work at the Dardenelles. I hope there are a lot more of the boys from Lilydale gone to help keep the good name up. I hope one day, if I am spared through this war, to return to Australia and renew old acquaintances'.

He served in France until November 1915 and then his battery was sent to Persia along with Indian and British forces to help defend the garrison town of Kut, along the Tigris River, from the Turkish forces. They weren't there long when the town was attacked by over whelming Turkish troops and besieged. Alfred Niblett was killed in action here on February 7th, 1916 and is buried in the British War Cemetery in Basra. The rest of the forces here surrendered in April 1916 after 147 days beseiged and were taken prisoner. Only 30% would survive their captivity. MT EVELYN FURPHYS
