# MEMORIAL UNVEILED TO MAJOR SCURRY

On Sunday December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015 a good crowd turned out on a hot, windy day to commemorate the centenary of the evacuation of Gallipoli and to pay tribute to a local who was instrumental in getting them off the Peninsula safely, Major William Scurry.

Major Scurry grew up in Ascot Vale and enlisted in the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion in World War One. He served on Gallipoli and while there invented the time release rifle that was set up on the night of the evacuation and helped fool the Turks into thinking the Anzacs were still there. Scurry then served on the Western Front, was wounded and eventually returned home to marry a war nurse. They settled on a property in Silvan. On the day a special plaque detailing Major Scurry's life and the role he played in the evacuation was unveiled by his daughter Judith Storey at his grave. Many members of the Scurry family were present including one who flew down from Brisbane.

In 2016 the Mt Evelyn RSL plans on publishing a biography of Major Scurry and have already received a grant from the State Government to do so.



#### TRIBUTE TO SEVILLE SOLDIER



On Christmas Day 2015 a small group gathered at one of the few remaining trees left from the Seville WWI Avenue of Honour to pay tribute to the centenary of the death of Seville Soldier, Arthur Douglas. Arthur lived in Seville and enlisted in WWI, serving with the 6<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance. He was severely wounded while serving Gallipoli and was evacuated to a hospital on Malta where he passed away on December 25th, 1915. His nephew, Ian Douglas, read out Arthur's life story while dressed in a WWI uniform. He then placed a memorial sign and poppy wreath at the base of the tree in his uncle's memory.


#### **COMMUNITY AWARDS**







On February 19<sup>th</sup>, 1916, 17 year old Jim Baddeley forged his mother's signage on his enlistment papers and joined the AIF underage.

Seventy-six years later, at the age of 93, he sat down with the Lilydale RSL's historian to record his memories of his wartime experiences with the 58<sup>th</sup> Battalion on the Western Front.

From the terrible winter on the Somme to surviving shell blast at Bapaume, from the horror of the Battle of Polygon Wood to the gas attacks at Ypres, from trench raids at Messines to the killing grounds of Villers Bretonneaux, Ville-Sur-Ancre, Peronne and Bellicourt.

It is a story of sacrifice and endurance, bravery and loss, good times and bad times. An ordinary young Australian who survived extraordinary times.

## VALE HENRIK ZIMMERMANN

We are sad to report the passing of member Henrik Zimmermann, aged 68, on December 29<sup>th</sup>, 2015 after a long illness. Our thoughts are with his children Steen, Dayle & Terri and grandchildren Noah & Eva.

Henrik was a stalwart of the club about 10 years ago and did much to assist the membership however illness has kept him away in recent times. He was also a member of the Mt Evelyn CFA for a number of years.

Henrik immigrated to Australia from Denmark with his family when he was nine years old in 1956. His brother Claus served in the Australian Army in Vietnam.

Henrik had a long career in the Australian Army, joining 2 Commando Company in May 1966. During his time here he had a great collection of mates, they all went overseas together and in the years that following all took it in turns of being best man at each other's weddings. One remembers a party at Henrik's place on a hot day when the ice ran out in the bath and one of them bought in a CO2 fire extinguisher to cool them off with a spray.

In 1973 he transferred to the 4/19<sup>th</sup> Prince of Wales's Light Horse Regiment and he served here until 1982, finishing up with the rank of Warrant Officer Class Two. During this period he also spent time with 3 Training Group at the Officer Cadet Training Unit.



# A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he jouned the 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Ambalance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for nervice overseas his finncée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he west through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little dianies is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called "The Great War".

But his life back bome in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.

The Heroic Life of George Ingram VC, MM



This is the biography of Captain George Ingram VC, MM, the Yarra Valley's only recipient of the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest award for valor on the battlefield.

From a country boyhood growing up in Seville, to serving with the artillery in Victoria and Rabaul and on to the bouror and heroism of the Western Front with the 24th Battalion AIF where he was awarded both the Military Medal and the Victoria Cross.

After the war he spent time as a soldier settler before serving with the Shrine Guard and the Royal Australian Engineers in WW2.





## FRANK LESLIE NICHOLLS

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

**Frank Leslie Nicholls** was born in Brunswick in 1891, one of six children to William and Lillie Nicholls. His father, William Nicholls, had served with the Victoria Colonial Forces and, after Federation, with the militia, eventually rising to the rank of Captain before being placed on the retired list.

Frank grew up in Malvern and served three years in the cadets while at school. Much of his youth was spent on the family's property in Queens Rd, Wandin and after finishing school he farmed the property in Wandin and became well known in the district.

On August 25<sup>th</sup>, 1914, aged 23, he enlisted in the AIF. His medical record shows he was five feet, seven & a half inches tall, had dark brown hair and hazel eyes, was single and his religion was Church of England.

He undertook his basic training at Broadmeadows where he was allotted to the 5<sup>th</sup> Battalion. While here he was presented, along with a number of other local soldiers, with a certificate of appreciation from the President of the Shire of Lillydale. The community of Wandin also presented him with a medallion.

Frank left Australia on the first convoy, travelling on the Orvieto. He spent a number of months training in Egypt, once getting into trouble for neglecting to obey an NCO and getting docked seven days pay.

At the landing at Anzac Cove on that first Anzac Day, he was in the second wave that hit the beaches and advanced up the cliffs. He survived the first day but sadly on the following day, he was killed in action.

He was later buried at the Lone Pine Cemetery. His mother eventually receiving a small parcel with his belongings that included a wallet, photos, 2 pipes, a handkerchief and his identity disc.

In The Argus newspaper his parents placed a notice that said: *'He gave his life for his country and for his country's honor'*.

In 1919 the Wandin community had a welcome home function for local soldiers and Frank Nicholls parents were invited and were presented with letter expressing the community's deep regret and sympathy at Frank's loss. His name was placed on the Wandin War Memorial in 1927 and a tree was planted in his name in the Wandin Avenue of Honour.

On April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the centenary of the day he died, the Mt Evelyn RSL conducted a ceremony at the Wandin War Memorial in his memory. Two of Frank's nieces came along with their family on the day to commemorate their uncle. **Right:** *Photo of them laying wreath under his name*.
