The event had been organised by the Hon Tony Smith MP, federal member for Casey, as a fund raiser for the new Seville War Memorial, soon to be constructed.

On the day those attending were treated to rare objects on display from Breaker Morant, including his dog tag and the flag that draped his coffin, and Brigadier Sir William Bourchier, commanding officer of the 4th Light Horse who lead them in the charge at Beersheba.

Also on the day the crowd was given a look at what the Seville War Memorial will look like by members of the Seville War Memorial Committee.



NEW SIGN




The Shire of Yarra Ranges Council has kindly upgraded the sign for Mt Evelyn's War Memorial Gardens and it looks great.

This one is much more secure and slightly larger and able to be seen clearer from a distance.


NEW MT EVELYN RSL STUBBY HOLDERS

MONASH'S MILITIA CAMP

LILYDALE - FEBRUARY 1914

100 years ago John Monash and 3000 citizen soldiers descended on Lilydale and camped for week where the Lillydale Lake is today.

While they were there they were visited by General Sir Ian Hamilton & Richard Williams of RAAF fame and held a huge 'mock battle' near Melba's home in Coldstream.



A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2nd Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.



On December 8th, 1915 there were 38,500 Australian troops occupying trenches on Gallipoli, facing a larger Turkish force of some 80,000. Twelve days later they had all been evacuated from the Peninsula without the loss of a man and without the enemy

Anzacs were still in their trenches shooting at them when in fact they had long gone. It would earn for him the Distinguished Conduct Medal and the gratitude of those who had got off Gallipoli safely.

But this was only a small part of the Bill Scurry story. From Egypt to Gallipoli and on to the Western Front, where he lost an eye and gained the Military Cross. Then to his post-war days as a soldier settler in Silvan before he was to serve once more in the Second World War.



CECIL BENJAMIN FARR

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

Cecil Benjamin Farr was born in 1894 at Mooroolbark, the son of William Farr, an English immigrant from Birmingham. Cecil spent his youth on the family's property in Mooroolbark before they moved to Ferntree Gully to take up farming there.

After he finished his schooling Cecil took up odd jobs as a labourer in the Ferntree Gully district. His brother, William Ernest Farr, enlisted in the AIF in 1914 and served on Gallipoli during 1915 with the 8th Battalion.

On September 11th, 1915 Cecil walked into the recruiting centre at the Melbourne Town Hall and enlisted in the AIF. His medical records show that he was five feet, nine inches tall, had dark hair and blue eyes.

He undertook his initial training at the army camp at Royal Park and then Seymour before finishing his training at Broadmeadows where his was allotted to the 8th reinforcements for the 24th Battalion and given the regimental number 3491. He embarked with his unit from Port Melbourne on the HMAT Afric on January 1st, 1916.

The following month his was in camp at Egypt where the AIF was being reorganised. As a result he ended up being transferred from the 24th Battalion into the 8th Battalion, possibly because his brother William was in this battalion.

In March 1916 the 8th Battalion was sent to France arriving in the Somme Valley area in May. In June he and his brother William must have had a wonderful reunion as both were charged with drunkenness while at reserve billets in Sailly. Both were sentenced to 14 days prison and docked 29 days pay.

The 8th battalion's first major action on the Western Front was at the battle of Pozieres and on July 23rd, 1916 the battalion was moved into the forward lines and ordered to advance on the village.

On July 28th, Cecil was advancing along the Albert-Bapuame Road when he was killed in action. He was twenty-two years of age.

Today he is remembered on the memorial at Villers Bretonneaux in France.

Cecil's death wouldn't be the only tragedy the family would experience in the war. A younger brother, Basil Farr, enlisted after Cecil's death and was killed in action with the 21st Battalion at Passchendaele in October 1917. Their older brother William Ernest Farr survived the war and returned to Australia in December 1918.
