Recently the Minister for Veterans' Affairs Warren Snowdon announced a new program to maintain the graves of our bravest. The program through the Office of the Australian War Graves will provide for the maintenance in perpetuity of the graves of all Australian Victoria Cross, Cross of Valour and George Cross recipients, wherever they may lie. VC graves which are not currently covered by the existing program of official commemoration will be included, as will the graves of one New Zealand and eighteen British VC recipients buried in Australia.

The Green Thing.....

In the line at the store the other day, the check out girl told an older woman that she should bring her own grocery bags because plastic bags weren't good for the environment.

The woman apologized to him and explained, "We didn't have the green thing back in my day." The cashier responded, "That's our problem today. Your generation did not care enough to save our environment."



Back then, we returned milk bottles, soft drink bottles and beer bottles to the store. The store sent them back to the plant to be washed and sterilized and refilled, so it could use the same bottles over and over. So they really were recycled. *But we didn't have the green thing back in our day*.

We walked up stairs, because we didn't have an escalator in every store and office building. We walked to the grocery store and didn't climb into a 300-horsepower machine every time we had to go two blocks. But she was right. We didn't have the green thing in our day.

Back then, we washed the baby's diapers because we didn't have the throw-away kind. We dried clothes on a line, not in an energy gobbling machine burning up 220 volts -- wind and solar power really did dry the clothes. Kids got hand-me down clothes from their brothers or sisters, not always brand-new clothing. But that woman is right. We didn't have the green thing back in our day.

Back then, we had one TV, or radio, in the house -- not a TV in every room. And the TV had a small screen the size of a handkerchief (remember them?), not a screen the size of Tasmania! In the kitchen, we blended and stirred by hand because we didn't have electric machines to do everything for us.

When we packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, we used a wadded up old newspaper to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble wrap. Back then, we didn't fire up an engine and burn gasoline just to cut the lawn. We used a push mower that ran on human power. We exercised by working so we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity. But she's right; we didn't have the green thing back then.


We drank from a fountain when we were thirsty instead of using a cup or a plastic bottle every time we had a drink of water. We refilled writing pens with ink instead of buying a new pen, and we replaced the razor blades in a razor instead of throwing away the whole razor just because the blade got dull. *But we didn't have the green thing back then.*

Back then, people took the train or a bus and kids rode their bikes to school or walked instead of turning their mums or grandparents into a 24-hour taxi service. We had one electrical outlet in a room, not an entire bank of sockets to power a dozen appliances. And we didn't need a computerized gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites 20,000 Kilometres out in space in order to find the nearest pizza joint.

But isn't it sad the current generation laments how wasteful we old folks were just because:

We didn't have the green thing back then?





RSL To Apply For A Howitzer Field Gun For Display

The Mt Evelyn RSL recently got word from the Department of Defence that they are disposing of 39 M2A2 Howitzer Field Guns (see photo left). These guns were critical in providing close artillery fire support to the Australian Army in Vietnam.

They are only being offered to RSLs & historical organisations and as a result the Mt Evelyn RSL has decided to apply for one. This has been a long held dream of many members, especially Derek & Betty Crittenden.

There is a cost of \$4000 to 'demilitarise' them plus there are other costs associated with transport and site preparation. The committee however is confident of getting funding for this. *Stay tuned*....

Recently the Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Hugh Delahunty MP, launched the 'Victorian War Heritage Inventory'.



Vale Marjorie Deighton (1917-2011)

The sub-branch is sad to announce the passing of one of its long time service members, Madge Deighton (nee Hunkin) aged 94.

Madge served with the 'Women's Royal Naval Service' as a typist with the Port Division from 1940 to 1942.

This was during the Battle of Britain and the Blitz, when the whole of England became the frontline and tonnes of German bombs were dropped on cities & docks in the United Kingdom. Madge herself experienced at least one significant bombing raid at the Naval establishment she was posted at. In the late 1960's Madge immigrated to Australia with her late husband Ivan & son Roland (who saw 19 years service in the RAF & the RAAF).

History of the Mt Evelyn RSL – pt 4

The following was written by A J McAleer as a chapter in the book 'Tracks to Trails – A History of Mt Evelyn'. Continuing from last edition...

The big issue for the Mt Evelyn RSL in the late 1980s – early 1990's was to have their own clubrooms. Secretary/Treasurer John Urand recalled: "The hall we were at had become unsuitable for us, no storage area and such, so we started looking at building our own room somewhere. In the meantime through general hard work we raised money from bingo, street stalls and dances".

A building committee was formed and fundraising increased with the help of the Ladies Auxiliary under the leadership of Betty Urand. In 1994 their quest for a permanent home lead to meetings with the Shire Council who agreed to approve two thirds of the funding for an extension to the Senior Citizens building. A number of initial objections were eventually overcome and work began the following year. A ten-year loan was taken to fund the RSL's one-third payment, and this was amazingly paid out some eight years early, thanks mainly to the Ladies Auxiliary and others who ran the weekly bingo.

In February 1996 in front of a large audience, the new Mt Evelyn RSL clubrooms were officially opened by the Chief Commissioner of the Shire of Yarra Ranges, Richard Longmore. It ended the club's nomadic existence of 27 years & gave the sub-branch a home. It also meant the club had come full circle to almost the same building from where they were formed.

On the day John Urand told those gathered: "Five years ago when I was talking to several members I said 'why don't we try to get our own rooms?' Apart from looking at me as though I had just returned from a trip to Mars, I was told 'no it's not possible'. Well I am here to tell you the impossible is possible. Today we have our own lovely rooms". To be continued......
