UNVEILING OF RALPH GOODE MBE MURAL AT LILYDALE HIGH SCHOOL

On Thursday April 9th, members of the Mt Evelyn RSL were pleased to attend the unveiling of special project that the Lilydale High School had put together as their centenary of Anzac project.

Inspired by our book 'A Stretcher Bearer's War', the war diaries of Ralph Goode, the first man from Lilydale to enlist in WWI, the school commissioned artist Brad Colling (well known as the artist of the murals at the Mt Evelyn War Memorial Park) to work the students to create a mural that told the story of Ralph's service in World War One

The school held a special ceremony hosted by the history teachers, Kirsty Ann Mays and Darren Strachan, that included special guests Cr Maria McCarthy (Mayor of the Shire of Yarra Ranges), Christine Fyffe MLA, Tony Smith MP and Ted Baillieu (Chair of the Victorian Centenary of Anzac Committee and former Premier of Victoria). James Merlino MLA, deputy Premier and Minister for Education, officially unveiled the mural.

Ralph Goode's two daughter, Merle Slattery & Shirley Burchall, along with six of his granddaughters where there to see the tribute and were very happy with the mural.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

During 2014 the RSL State Branch introduced RSL Sub-branches to their proposed 'Volunteer Management Strategy'. This new strategy will bring the RSL in Victoria into compliance with the National Standards for Volunteers, for involving volunteers in not for profit organisations.

Mt Evelyn RSL Sub-branch committee and members rely on friends of the Sub-branch who assist the branch to fulfil their community obligations. Our other obligation is to protect the health and safety of all of our members and volunteers under the Occupational Health and Safety Act 2004.

RSL members and volunteers are covered by RSL insurance whilst engaged in RSL related activities providing they are registered volunteers or appear on a volunteers register. The Sub-branch will need to formalise our volunteer register in order to protect our volunteers and if necessary ensure their details are included on the soon to be available RSL Volunteer Management System Database. The RSL Victoria Branch will be trialling the proposed volunteer strategy on a select number of sub-branches prior to introducing the strategy State-wide.

On that note make sure you visit our volunteer sellers out the front of Mt Evelyn IGA who are selling Anzac Tokens for us over the next few weeks – they are doing a wonderful job in raising funds for the welfare of ex-service people.

I would sincerely like to thank all Sub-branch members and friends for the beautiful flowers and kind thoughts that have assisted my family in dealing with my dear wife Julie's illness.

Shown below is an actual letter that was sent to a bank (definitely not our Bendigo Bank!!!) by an 86 year old woman. The bank manager thought it amusing enough to have it published in the Times.

Dear Sir:

I am writing to thank you for bouncing my cheque with which I endeavoured to pay my plumber last month. By my calculations, three nanoseconds must have elapsed between his presenting the cheque and the arrival in my account of the funds needed to honor it. I refer, of course, to the automatic monthly deposit of my entire pension, an arrangement which, I admit, has been in place for only eight years.

You are to be commended for seizing that brief window of opportunity, and also for debiting my account £30 by way of penalty for the inconvenience caused to your bank.

My thankfulness springs from the manner in which this incident has caused me to rethink my errant financial ways. I noticed that whereas I personally answer your telephone calls and letters, — when I try to contact you, I am confronted by the impersonal, overcharging, prerecorded, faceless entity which your bank has become.

From now on, I, like you, choose only to deal with a flesh-and-blood person.

My mortgage and loan repayments will therefore and hereafter no longer be automatic, but will arrive at your bank, by cheque, addressed personally and confidentially to an employee at your bank whom you must nominate.

Be aware that it is an OFFENSE under the Postal Act for any other person to open such an envelope. Please find attached an Application Contract which I require your chosen employee to complete.

I am sorry it runs to eight pages, but in order that I know as much about him or her as your bank knows about me, there is no alternative.

Please note that all copies of his or her medical history must be countersigned by a Notary Public figure, and the mandatory details of his/her financial situation (income, debts, assets and liabilities) must be accompanied by documented proof.

In due course, at MY convenience, I will issue your employee with a PIN number which he/she must quote in dealings with me.

I regret that it cannot be shorter than 28 digits but, again, I have modelled it on the number of button presses required of me to access my account balance on your phone bank service.

As they say, imitation is the sincerest form of flattery. Let me level the playing field even further.

When you call me, press buttons as follows: IMMEDIATELY AFTER DIALLING, PRESS THE STAR (*) BUTTON FOR ENGLISH

#1. To make an appointment to see me

#2. To query a missing payment.

#3. To transfer the call to my living room in case I am there.

#4 To transfer the call to my bedroom in case I am sleeping.

#5. To transfer the call to my toilet in case I am attending to nature.

#6. To transfer the call to my mobile phone if I am not at home.

#7. To leave a message on my computer, a password to access my computer is required.

Password will be communicated to you at a later date to that Authorized Contact mentioned earlier

#8. To return to the main menu and to listen to options 1 to 9

#9. To make a general complaint or inquiry.

The contact will then be put on hold, pending the attention of my automated answering service. While this may, on occasion, involve a lengthy wait, uplifting music will play for the duration of the call.

Regrettably, but again following your example, I must also levy an establishment fee to cover the setting up of this new arrangement.

PEARSON BUGLE

Thanks to Essendon historian, Lenore Frost, we have been able to definitely prove that the bugle was owned by Ernest Pearson. The following is an article from The Essendon Gazette and Keilor, Bulla and Broadmeadows Reporter (12/4/1917).

Bugler E. A. Pearson, of Epsom road, Ascot Vale, who was a member of the Ascot Vale Bugle Band before he enlisted, has been awarded the military medal. The deed for which he received the medal was told in a letter from Major Knox-Knight, as follows -"One of my splendid lads, 385 Bugler E. A. Pearson, A Company, who is only a boy of 18, did magnificent work on Xmas night. He carried an important message right through Fritz's artillery barrage to the Battalion on our right, and brought the answer back, with artillery bursting all round him the whole time. He was knocked over twice by explosions, and when he got back was completely done up. Lieut. J. A. Carrodus also wrote in glowing terms of the exploit of the young soldier.

We have also received word from Gordon Kinghorn, the gentleman from England who donated the bugle. He says: 'I am very pleased that the bugle had gone home to Victoria where it belongs. The bugle had been in the possession of 3 generations of my family from the time of the First World War. I had tried to return it some years earlier to the museum in Melbourne, as you can see by the note of the address of the museum on the envelope which I received from the British War Museum. I have handled the bugle many times over the years, from a small boy at my grandfather's home, to it coming to my father on his death, and eventually me, and I have often wondered about its owner. I am delighted that Eric found you and that it has found a home with your branch of the Returned Services League'.


Gordon was also surprised he found some similarities with Ernest Pearson: 'When I was called up for military service in 1947 I did 3 months training on 25 pound guns at Larkhill, Salisbury Plain, England, (where Ernest undertook training) and in later years I too owned general grocery stores. How strange a coincidence is that?'



The Heroic Life of George Ingram VC, MM



This is the biography of Captain George Ingram VC, MM, the Yarra Valley's only recipient of the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest award for valor on the battlefield.

From a country boyhood growing up in Seville, to serving with the artillery in Victoria and Rabaul and on to the horror and heroism of the Western Front with the 24th Battalion AIF where he was awarded both the Military Medal and the Victoria Cross.

After the war he spent time as a soldier settler before serving with the Shrine Guard and the Royal Australian Engineers in WW2.



RALPH GOODE'S FAMILY DONATE COLLECTION TO MUSEUM

Recently the Mt Evelyn RSL were guests at a special afternoon tea at the Yarra Ranges Regional Museum to mark the donation of the Ralph and Kathleen Goode Collection to the museum's archives. Since our club published the Ralph Goode diaries last year the family decided it was the right time to gather the collection together and donate it to the people of this district as a tribute to the centenary of Ralph's service as a stretcher bearer on Gallipoli. The collection is probably the most significant Lilydale collection to come to the museum. It includes some very rare Lilydale photos that Kathleen Goode (who lived her entire life in Lilydale) had kept as well as items pertaining to Ralph's community and military service, including his medals and war diaries.



A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2nd Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.




MILITIA CAMP







BILL HARRISON'S STORY – pt 9

This is the story of one of our past members, Bill Harrison. Bill served with the 1st Independent Company during World War Two and was a member of the Mt Evelyn RSL for a short time in the 1990's. In 1999 Anthony McAleer sat down with him and interviewed him about his memories of the war. What follows is Bill's story......

Last issue: Training others in Jungle warfare

How did you travel to Morotai?

We got on a 'LST' (Landing Ship, Tank), not the most comfortable cruise ships by any means. When we went around the north of New Guinea, opposite Wewak, we went through a storm. It was a terrific storm, gees the ship rolled; even the sailors were getting seasick. Quite a few of us that weren't seasick had to stand watch as the sailors were all sick. At one stage we were on the top deck under and in trucks and things when suddenly the trucks started moving, they weren't properly tied down. It became really quite dangerous as these things were moving around. They had tanks and armoured cars down on the tank deck, they also got a bit lose too but fortunately I didn't have to go down and chain them up. Quite a lot of the trucks went over the side actually, first one broke through the rails, and then once the rails had the break in them they became weak and more were going over. They had pontoons chained on to the side of the ship, big pontoons that were about twenty foot tubes that they just dropped into the water chained together to make a rough pier out of them, that saved a lot of the trucks. There were a couple of blokes too who were washed overboard as well.

What was your role on Morotai?

Actually we weren't on Morotai very long. Before we knew it we were off to be landed on Balikpapan in Dutch Borneo.

What are your memories of the landing at Balikpapan?

It was a walk over really. It was a rehearsal for the 7th Division who it was thought would be going to the Philippines as they expected a long and projected fight in the Philippines and they thought we would be needed. Failing that we fully expected we were to land on Japan. I think it was more for headquarters to work out the logistics. There were only about 14,000 Japs there and the Division group that landed there had 43,000. It was the first time we'd outnumbered the Japs.

We went down in 'LSDs' (Landing Ship, Docks) and then transferred to 'LCVP's' (Landing Craft, Vehicle, Personnel) they hold about 20 men. The Yanks had these rocket ships, there were about four or five of them, and I think they had eight hundred and forty-eight rockets on those ships. They would steam up to the coast and just disappear in a cloud of smoke and then an equivalent cloud of smoke would appear on the shore. They would then sail out and go and load up again, then the next one in line would come in. We were just going around in circles in our LCVPs about 400 or 500 yards off the shore watching these rocket ships, it was beautiful to watch, they sort of put down a carpet before we landed.


We then went ashore in the LCVPs, we landed in the first wave, about ten minutes ahead of the main force, mainly to escort some engineers who were cleaning minefields.
