# THE CENTENARY OF ARMISTICE

The Centenary of Armistice was commemorated locally in a number of ways. The first event was a special school's commemorative service, held on Friday November 9<sup>th</sup>, at the Mt Evelyn War Memorial that involved three local schools. Guest speaker was Major (rtd) Ken Mackenzie OAM who told the kids a moving story of his grandfather who was a First World War veteran and how he felt about horses being in the war. There was also a very popular visit by Simpson and his donkey (see above).

On Sunday November 11<sup>th</sup>, we had our traditional Remembrance Day Service. Our secretary Anthony McAleer OAM told the story of what happened locally on the day the armistice was announced and how Melba rang the fire bell. Afterwards everyone came back to the club for a wonderful afternoon tea and the unveiling of plaques in memory of members Arch Carswell and Kathie Freeman who passed away this year. At 2.00pm a few members ventured down to the Lilydale High School for the performance of 'Yarra Valley Remembers' which told the story of what happened in this area during World War One. It also included the launch of the website 'War Diary – what happened to the men and women of the Shire of Lillydale in WWI'.

At 5.00pm a good crowd turned up at the Mt Evelyn War Memorial to hear pipers Iain Townsley and Neil Chisholm perform 'The Battle's O'er'. This was being performed at the same time by pipers all over the world as a special tribute to the centenary of the armistice. (more photos inside).



The Mt Evelyn RSL has had some new stubby holders made promoting the club.



## **OUR PIPER AT TIDAL RIVER**








### SEVILLE WAR MEMORIAL



# YARRA VALLEY VIETNAM VETERANS



Fifty years after they served Australia in the Vietnam War, sixteen veterans of that conflict from the Yarra Valley sat down with the Mt Evelyn RSL's historian and revealed, some for the first time, their wartime experiences.

Their stories tell of our nation's involvement in Vietnam and spans the period 1964 to 1972. They served with the Navy, with the Regular Army, with the CMF and as National Servicemen. Their backgrounds varied as much as their experiences 'in country' during that time.

It is a story of sacrifice and endurance, bravery and loss, good times and bad times. It reveals the environment they were forced to exist in and the role they played, from the mundane to the terrifying.

Surviving all of this they then returned home to a nation where many people ignored or even condemned them. For most, those decades after the war were an ongoing battle to deal with the physical and mental scars.





## A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.



## **SCURRY**

## THE MAN WHO GOT THEM SAFELY OFF GALLIPOLI



On December 8<sup>th</sup>, 1915 there were 38,500 Australian troops occupying trenches on Gallipoli, facing a larger Turkish force of some 80,000. Twelve days later they had all been evacuated from the Peninsula without the loss of a man and without the enemy knowing.

How they did this was helped in no small way by an ingenious invention created by twenty year old Lance-Corporal Bill Scurry, a self-firing rifle with a primitive timer that would convince the Turkish soldiers that the Anzacs were still in their trenches shooting at them when in fact they had long gone. It would earn for him the Distinguished Conduct Medal and the gratitude of those who had got off Gallipoli safely.

But this was only a small part of the Bill Scurry story. From Egypt to Gallipoli and on to the Western Front, where he lost an eye and gained the Military Cross. Then to his post-war days as a soldier settler in Silvan before he was to serve once more in the Second World War.







#### WILLIAM THOMPSON

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

William Theodore Thompson was born in July 1895 at Mitcham, Victoria, the eldest of six children to Walter Thompson and Catherine Letitia Thompson (nee McMillan). His father had grown up at Seville and worked as a blacksmith. In his youth young William spent time living at Launching Place, Warburton, Wandin, Wangaratta and Fitzroy, where ever his father could find work. While the family lived at Wandin he attended the Wandin State School, in fact just after the war started the family moved back to Wandin, to a property called 'Paradise' in Wandin North.

After he finished his schooling William obtained an apprenticeship as an electrical mechanical engineer with the Excelsoir Electrical Company in Latrobe St, Melbourne, at the time he was living in Barkly Street, North Fitzroy. During this period he also served with the militia, serving four years with the Senior Cadets of the 54<sup>th</sup> (Merri Creek) Infantry Battalion and six months as a member of the 54<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion. His soldiering skills must have impressed those in charge as he served as a Lieutenant for most of the period he was with the militia.

Soon after the war began in 1914, William's father Walter tried to enlist but being just five feet, three inches tall he was rejected as a result of his height. Later, when the casualties starting coming in from the Gallipoli campaign, the authorities weren't as fussy and he was he was accepted on his second attempt in June 1915 at the age of forty-four. Because of his blacksmithing skills and work with horses he was assigned as a driver with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Company Engineers and left Australia in October 1915. He would go on to serve in Egypt, France, Belgium and England.

With his father enlisting in the AIF, young William was inspired to join up as well and on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 1916, he walked into the recruiting depot at the Melbourne Town Hall and signed up. His medical records show he was five feet, nine inches tall, had brown eyes and black hair. Being aged just nineteen at the time he had to obtain written consent from his parents in order to be allowed to serve overseas. He undertook his initial training at a AIF training camp at Castlemaine and soon after was transferred to Bendigo and allotted to 'A' company of the 38th Battalion, he was given the regimental number 405. Here his soldiering skills must have stood out again as he was promoted to Corporal in April and then Sergeant in May. He embarked with his unit from Port Melbourne on the HMAT Runic on June 20th, 1916.

Two months later he was in camp at Salisbury in England, undergoing further training before proceeding to the front. In November 1916 the 38<sup>th</sup> Battalion crossed the channel to France and soon after had begun to occupy trenches on the Western Front, just in time for the onset of the terrible winter of 1916-1917. During Xmas 1916 William's battalion was moved to Armentieres in France and in the first few weeks on the new year were regularly subjected to artillery, machine gun and sniper fire. On January 6<sup>th</sup>, 1917 he was commissioned once again as a Second Lieutenant.

On the night of January 16<sup>th</sup>, 1917 William was on duty in the front line trenches when he was suddenly shot and killed by enemy machine gun fire. He was just twenty years old at the time and had only been in action a few weeks.

His body was later buried at the Cite Bon Jean Military Cemetery in Armentieres, France. A parcel of his belongings were later sent home to his family in Wandin. The family's notice in the newspaper simply stated 'One of

the best'.

In September that year a golden cypress tree was planted in the grounds of the Wandin State School just opposite us in his memory.

death created hardship for his family though. Still in France in early 1918 his father applied to return home to Australia stating: 'Upon the loss of my son, the sole support of my wife and five children has fallen upon my shoulders. My wife at present is greatly worried owing to the loss of son and financial our difficulties and my absence'. Backed by his commanding officer he was given permission to return home in April 1918 and the family lived for a number of years at another property in Wandin North called 'Kooloonong'. Sadly though this wouldn't be the only war time casualty this family would experience. In December 1943, during another World War, William's brother, Henry Victor Thompson, died of illness while a prisoner of war of the Japanese on the Burma-Thailand Railway. brothers' names are listed on the Wandin War Memorial.
