The sub-branch is sad to announce the passing of another of its long time members, Joyce Clough, aged 84.

Joyce served with the 'WAAAF' during World War Two, enlisting only a few days after her 18th birthday. Joyce's wartime service was short; she was discharged only a few months into her enlistment because the war suddenly ended. In fact recently at an RSL meeting she told us it was her enlistment that ended the war – once she signed up, the enemy knew they had no chance! But her length of service makes no difference – Joyce's wartime service is still one of bravery, self-sacrifice, endurance and devotion. She was proud to say 'I served' and we were proud of her for doing so.

For many years she was the only female service member amongst the males at Mt Evelyn RSL meetings and she was a keen worker with the 'Women's Auxiliary' and selling poppies. Our thoughts are with her family.

History of the Mt Evelyn RSL – pt 5

The following was written by A J McAleer as an update to the chapter he wrote in the book '*Tracks to Trails – A History of Mt Evelyn*'. Continuing from last edition...

One of the first projects the club undertook when they moved into their new home was to create a 'Memorial Garden' that would carry the names of Mt Evelyn RSL members who had passed away. It was dedicated in December 1996 with 25 names and over the years the ashes of a number of members were interred there, although this is a practice which has since ceased. Inside the club the tribute to members continued with a display wall of photos of the RSL members in uniform.

Throughout the 1990's the club made best use of its new clubrooms and the adjoining 'Hardy House' hall to host social functions. Bingo afternoons & dance evenings continued and a tradition was started with socials on Thursdays & Fridays, some of these nights even offered dinner to patrons. In fact the chief ingredient to the success of these socials was the work done by the Women's Auxiliary, a stalwart of which was Betty Crittenden who in 2009 was awarded a life membership.

In 1998 a new president was elected, Bill Youngs, a 34 year veteran of both the Royal Navy & the Royal Australian Navy who had served in five conflicts including World War Two, Korea, Malaya, Borneo & Vietnam. Bill was also part of a committee who organised for an RSL memorial to be built at the front of the hall, this was unveiled in 2001 by two stalwarts of the club; Bill Phillips & Ralph Proctor. In the following years the club also supported a number of community groups who developed a new memorial gardens at the top of Wray Cres where, in 2003, the original RSL war memorial was moved to.

Around the same time Andy Franks built an office for the clubrooms using materials that his employer had donated, both Andy and long time secretary John Urand were later made Life Members of the RSL. Also during this period two other long time members, Bill Sibley & Laurie Hollier, became active in the club with Bill to later take over as President and Laurie as Treasurer/Secretary after the passing of John Urand in 2005. Another important fund raising tradition started during this time was the 'Two-up' held at the 'York On Lilydale' on Anzac Day.

In 2007 Derek Crittenden took over as President at a time when the 'Senior Citizen Group', who shared the hall with the RSL, were folding. Derek led the club through the important negotiations with the Shire to have the RSL take over the lease of the hall and he started off the club's popular annual 'dawn service'. Derek also recruited a number of stalwart members such as James Chapman, who became treasurer, Richard Schoenmaker, who became the club's Padre, and Brigadier Michael Phelps & Major Tony Geyer.

In 2010 the club received a grant from the Bendigo Bank to help finance the creation of glass display cabinets to exhibit the club's important collection of military and historical memorabilia. At the AGM of 2011 Derek retired and handed over the presidency to Roger Boness, a Vietnam veteran and member of the club since the 1970's.
