On behalf of the membership of the Mt Evelyn RSL we congratulate Roger for





For nearly 10 years now Tom has been bringing students up to the RSL to learn about the club and its members and has also done a great job teaching them about our Anzac history.




VALE - EDWARD O'REILLY




MONASH'S MILITIA CAMP

LILYDALE - FEBRUARY 1914

100 years ago John Monash and 3000 citizen soldiers descended on Lilydale and camped for week where the Lillydale Lake is today.

While they were there they were visited by General Sir Ian Hamilton & Richard Williams of RAAF fame and held a huge 'mock battle' near Melba's home in Coldstream.





A STRETCHER BEARER'S WAR

The Story of Ralph Goode MBE



In 1914 Ralph Goode became the first of many men from Lilydale to enlist in World War One when he joined the 2nd Field Ambulance as a stretcher-bearer. Before he left for service overseas his fiancée gave him two small diaries in which to write down his experiences.

Over the next four years he painstakingly recorded what he went through in Egypt, on Gallipoli and throughout the Western Front. What he created on the pages of those little diaries is an extraordinary day to day account of the horrors and heroism of serving as a stretcher bearer in what they called 'The Great War'.

But his life back home in those decades after the war was to be just as heroic. What he did to cope with the trauma of his war experience would benefit his community greatly and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.

THE MAN WHO GOT THEM SAFELY OFF GALLIPOLI



On December 8th, 1915 there were 38,500 Australian troops occupying trenches on Gallipoli, facing a larger Turkish force of some 80,000. Twelve days later they had all been evacuated from the Peninsula without the loss of a man and without the enemy

Anzacs were still in their trenches shooting at them when in fact they had long gone. It would earn for him the Distinguished Conduct Medal and the gratitude of those who had got off Gallipoli safely.

But this was only a small part of the Bill Scurry story. From Egypt to Gallipoli and on to the Western Front, where he lost an eye and gained the Military Cross. Then to his post-war days as a soldier settler in Silvan before he was to serve once more in the Second World War.



GEORGE STEWART BROWN

In commemoration of the centenary of World War One, the Mt Evelyn & Lilydale RSLs have divided the local war memorials between them and will be holding a service on the centenary date of those listed on these memorials who died while on active service. In connection with this will be publishing their biographies in each of our newsletters.....

George Stewart Brown was born in 1883 at Vermont, Vic, one of three children to John and Jane Elizabeth Brown. His father died when he was young and his mother later remarried to Thomas Fincham. The family then moved to Eltham where George attended the Eltham State School.

After he finished his schooling he became a qualified fitter and turner. Then just before the war began he took up a position in Lilydale and moved there, living at a property called 'Hillcrest'. His mother and step-father came to live there also

On January 28th, 1915 he walked into the recruiting depot at the Melbourne Town Hall and enlisted in the AIF. His medical records show that he was five feet, four inches tall, had dark brown hair and brown eyes. He undertook his initial training at the AIF training camp at Broadmeadows where he was allotted to 'D' Company of the original 21st Battalion along with two Lilydale soldiers, Thomas Eales and James Burns, and he was given the regimental number 802. He embarked with his unit from Port Melbourne on the HMAT Ulysses on May 8th, 1915.

The following month he was in camp in Egypt and then on August 30th the 21st Battalion boarded the troopship HMAT Southland bound for Gallipoli. On the way over however they were torpedoed by a German U-Boat and, with a hole in the side of the ship, all personnel were quickly ordered off and into the water. After a number of hours though, the ship still hadn't sunk and a skeleton crew was able to get the engines going again. A call was then made for volunteers to man the ship and to stoke the engine to get her into the nearest port. George Brown was one of a handful of soldiers who volunteered to do this and they were later mentioned in a special order by the Commander in Chief for doing so.

They managed to sail the ship into the harbour at Mudros Island where the 21st Battalion were being regrouped to be landed on Gallipoli. In September the battalion went ashore at Anzac Cove and were moved into the frontlines at Courtney's Post. George was there a few days later when his friend from Lilydale, James Drummond Burns, was killed in action.

George remained in the front lines at Gallipoli until the 21st Battalion were evacuated with the rest of the Anzac force in December 1915. He was eventually sent back to Egypt where a few months later the AIF were reorganised in preparation for being sent to the Western Front. It was at this time that George had a pleasant surprise when his younger brother, John Leonard Brown, who had enlisted a few months after him, arrived and was seconded into the 21st Battalion alongside George.

In March 1916 the 21st Battalion was sent to France arriving in the Somme Valley area in May. On July 23rd, 1916 the 1st Division attacked the village of Pozieres and over the next few days the 21st Battalion acted as a carrying party for them, moving food and ammunition up into the forward area.

On August 4th, 1916 the 21st Battalion were ordered to attack Pozieres Ridge. The following day George was sheltering in a shell hole not far from Mouquet Farm when an artillery shell burst just near him. He sustained horrific injuries from the blast including the loss of both his legs and most of both arms.

One witness, Lance Corporal Percy Mortimer, later said: 'I spoke to him as he was conscious. He called out 'I'm a Blighty case'. He was lying there some time before the stretcher bearers came and carried him away. I never

heard anything more about him'.

George Brown was carried back to the nearest casualty clearing station but he died there soon after of his wounds. He was 33. He was buried the Becourt at Military Cemetery in France. Sadly George's death wouldn't be the only tragedy the family would experience in the war. His younger Leonard brother. John Brown, was killed in action with the 21st Battalion at Villers Bretonneux in August 1918.
